
In September, the annual fall mum sale was in full swing. Each member was responsible fore pre-selling ten mums at \$15 each. Top sellers were:

OUTGOING MESSAGE FROM THE PAST PRESIDENT

The Junior Guild has been actively involved in Nash and Edgecombe County communities for 80 years. We once again had an extremely active year in the community in regards to both service and fundraising! The Junior Guild kicked off our year with our first ever Corporate Sponsorship Campaign. This campaign solicited annual sponsorship donations from our community partners, and we were able to raise approximately \$7,500.00 to assist and cover costs of our larger events and in turn route more money back into the Community.

We re-vamped our Community Trust Recipient process this past year and had a first successful application and granting cycle and will award 14 Community Trust Recipients this year.

In addition to our wonderful annual Fundraising events (Bargain Sale and Mum Sale), the Guild continued their presence in volunteering at the HOPE Program, InJoy Thrift Shop, the Tar River Orchestra, Rocky Mount Peacemakers, Meals on Wheels Beans and Brews event, and assisting the Salvation Army with Bell Ringing and Angel Tree shopping.



Our Puppet committee held our Puppet tradition strong and put on fabulous shows of "The Giving Tree." The committee hosted approximately 350 children over 25 shows this spring season! They were a combination of Public shows as well as school trips during the week.

We are also incredibly blessed by our 12 incredible Provisionals that have joined us this year. Their project was two-fold in an education partnership with the Boys and Girls Club as well as



toiletry drive. The toiletry donations were equally distributed and donated to My Sister's House, the Boys and Girls Club, and United Ministries. - Dues: \$5.00/year and Initiation fee: \$2.50
- First Project, Well Baby Clinic. In 1937 death rate in first year in each 1000 live births was 78.2
- Ways and Means first venture was a station with two girls on duty for Christmas wrapping and shipping at a table at May and Gorham's Drug Store for ten days before Christmas and opened the Women's Exchange and Lending Library (office/headquarters). Girls worked every day nine to five, except summer months when it was only open from nine to two.
